We hereby inform that the Rules for the Classification and Construction of Sea-Going Ships shall be amended as specified in the Appendices to the Circular Letter.

1 **Part XX** is renamed as "Additional Requirements for Yachts".

2 CLASS OF A SHIP

2 **Table 2.5.** In **item 1.18**, before the descriptive notation **Pipe laying barge** new descriptive notation **Passenger yacht** is introduced reading as follows:

3 **Table 2.5.** In **item 1.18**, after the descriptive notation **Tug** new descriptive notation **Yacht for commercial service** is introduced reading as follows:

PART XX. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR COMMERCIAL YACHTS

4 **Part XX** is renamed as "Additional Requirements for Yachts" on the front page, in annotation and imprint on the last page.

1 DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

5 **Section 1** is supplemented with the following text:

"Yacht means a decked self-propelled vessel, other than rowing craft, intended for water trips with persons lodged on board and having enclosed spaces used to accommodate all the persons the vessel is certified to carry.".

6 **Para 2.7** is replaced by the following text:

"2.7 The provisions of this Part do not apply to yachts carrying more than 12 passengers. Yachts carrying more than 12, but less than 36 passengers, are passenger yachts. Passenger yachts shall comply with the requirements of the Rules for the Classification and Construction of Sea-Going Ships, Rules for the Equipment of Sea-Going Ships applicable for passenger ships as well as Load Line Rules for Sea-Going Ships (for yachts intended for non-commercial use), Rules for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships Intended for Operation in Sea Areas and Inland Waterways of the Russian Federation (for yachts flying the RF flag) and, if applicable, international conventions, codes, and additional Flag State MA requirements. The national Flag State MA requirements¹ shall take precedence over similar requirements of the RS rules. Yachts carrying more than 36 passengers shall fully comply with all the requirements of the RS rules specified above that apply to passenger ships. For yachts carrying more than 12 persons, the class notation shall be assigned in accordance with Section 3.

3 CLASS OF A SHIP

7 **Para 3.1** is supplemented with the following text:

"Yachts specified in 2.7, intended for commercial or non-commercial use, carrying from 13 to 36 passengers, are assigned the descriptive notation **Passenger yacht** with account of 3.2 and 3.3.

Yachts specified in 2.7, intended for commercial or non-commercial use, carrying more than 36 passengers, are assigned the descriptive notation **Passenger ship** with account of the provisions in 2.2 of Part I "Classification" as well as 3.2 and 3.3 of this Part.".

¹ List of safety standards applied by the Register: Red Ensign Group – Yacht Code Part B – Passenger Yacht Code (PYC), Malta Commercial Yacht Code, Marshall Islands Yacht Code. In the absence of national MA standards, it is recommended to use PYC.".
